Government Bill *New world – new university (June 2005)*

- A strategy and a range of measures are presented to promote internationalisation of higher education
- The structure of educational programmes and degrees will change
- Higher education credits, but not grades, should be brought into line with the European model (ECTS).
- The Government considers to support higher education institutions to broaden their recruitment base. Dedicated resources can bolster efforts by HEI:s to recruit more broadly.
- The rules for admission to higher education are to be simplified and made fairer and more consistent.

Government Bill

New world – new university (June 2005)

- The structure of educational programmes and degrees will change, partly due to a division of higher education into three cycles. and the introduction of
 - a two-year Master's Degree will be introduced
 - a general one-year degree at the second level (magisterexamen)
 - an independent project should be a requirement for all degrees at first and second level
 - new descriptions based on the expected learning outcomes should be introduced for all degrees

Professional degrees

Programmes leading to a professional degree comprising 240 ECTS credits or more include both first and second cycle studies.

Such programmes will not be formally divided into two separate cycles.

Towards London 2007

- Continue the work on quality assurance, recognition and the three cycle degree system
- Follow the development of joint degrees and joint programmes
- Creating opportunities for flexible learning paths in higher education, including procedures for the recognition of prior learning
- Statistics on the mobility of students and staff
- Students social and economic dimension
